Transition Year Activities

In February our transition year students participated in an engaging **interactive law seminar** which was facilitated by Kate Hedigan of LawEd. The pupils were informed about various aspects of law including consumer law, employment rights, road traffic offences and the laws in relation to alcohol and drugs. Through the medium of a mock trial they also learned how a court operates, the roles of judges, barristers and solicitors, and the differences between civil and criminal cases. The pupils also learned about careers in law.

In February students completed their **work experience**. Work experience is an integral part of the Transition Year programme as the students are afforded the opportunity to learn new skills while also gaining an insight into possible career choices for their futures. The school would like to thank all the businesses and organisations which helped to facilitate this element of the Transition Year course by offering our students their work placements. Students have taken part in **Build A Bank, GAA Coaching Course and a Car Maintenance Course** to mention but a few activities. In early February students participated in a **Personal Safety Course** which was delivered by Personal Safety Ireland. The course focused on awareness, boundaries, consent and self-defence techniques. The pupils really enjoyed this practical and thought-provoking workshop.

This year's **School Musical**, 'Oh What A Night!', was performed in the Premier Hall on Thursday, Friday and Saturday night (25th -27th February). This lively and entertaining show features the music of Frankie Valli and The Four Seasons, including hits such as ' Sherry ', ' Can't take my eyes off you', ' Beggin' and 'Oh What A Night'. Using his own life story as an example, Mr. Campbell outlined how easy it can be to slip into addiction and he furnished the pupils with some effective strategies and advice so that they will be able to recognise the warning signs and thus avoid getting into any difficulties.

On Wednesday our first and second year students attended productions of Mr. Michael O Sullivan's Humourfit show, which analysed issues such as bullying in a humorous, interactive and thought-provoking manner.

Along with these activities, there was a 'Wellbeing' noticeboard in the foyer where students posted positive messages about mental health, subjects such as religion, S.P.H.E. and P.E. focused on wellbeing, and 'Mindfulness Moment' quotes were read out over the intercom each day.
